Goals & Objectives

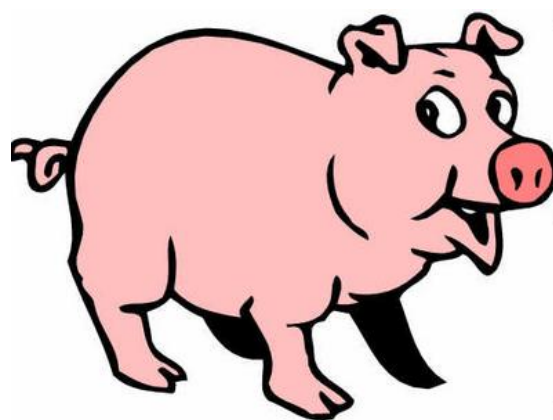

1. Poster size 17” wide by 11” high. The poster must be horizontal not vertical.
2. This contest is open for 16 years and under.
3. The art must be original and must be the work of one person.
4. The poster can be dropped off at the Nanaimo Bulletin or at the VIEX office at Beban Park.
5. Theme for 2018 is: **Barnyard Boogie**
6. The following words only, must appear on the poster, “Barnyard Boogie” please check your spelling.

The winning poster will be featured on the cover of our 2018 Prize Book. Winner will receive a one-day family pass with meal tickets for 4 to the 2018 VIEX. You will be featured with picture in the Program, and receive recognition with photo in the local newspaper. Competition closes April 15, 2018.

General Information

Services at Beban Park:

Camping is available at \$28.75 + GST per unit per day (one camper unit, one vehicle per campsite only). Limited electrical hook-ups are available on a "first come, first serve" basis. No water or sewer. As far as possible, everything necessary for the comfort of Exhibition visitor has been arranged at Beban Park, Administration office, Police, Fire, St. Johns Ambulance, Rest Rooms, ATM's, information and food concessions.

Fire and Police Protections:

Day and night watchmen are provided for all buildings and various areas with the grounds; every possible precaution is taken to reduce to a minimum the risk and probability of fire. Notwithstanding these precautions, the exhibition will not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage by fire, theft or otherwise. Should the exhibitors require their exhibits be covered by insurance, they should make this arrangement personally.

Emergency First Aid:

The St. John Ambulance will provide a First Aid Post on the grounds. Emergency First Aid is provided free of charge; additional services including ambulance fees are chargeable to the person receiving the service.

Lost & Found & Information:

Is located at the Show Office.

Opening & Closing:

The exhibition will open at 9:00 am Friday August 17th (except where otherwise stated.) Inquiries regarding the exhibition arrangements to be made to the office phone: 250-758-3247, or email info@viex.ca

Parking Vehicles: (Fair Weekend)

The Exhibition has a huge effect on the traffic pattern on Bowen Road. In consultation with the City of Nanaimo and RCMP, the following traffic and parking changes will be in effect: there will be no VIEx parking access from Bowen Road. All VIEx parking will be accessed from Labieux Road only. The south entrance to Beban Park from Bowen Road will be restricted to Emergency Response, Gate 1 - Tourist Bureau visitors, golfers and tennis players. Drop offs, deliveries made to Gate# 4. The north entrance to Beban Park from Labieux will be one-way. The right lane will be dedicated to pay parking in the paved lots near the main entrance (gate 2). The left lane will be dedicated to drop-off, vendor & home show deliveries, Parks & Rec staff and office, Altrusa Playground & VIP Access. The BMX Track entrance to the park from Labieux road will be restricted to VIEx registered volunteers to park and Emergency Response. The south entrance to Beban Park from Labieux Road will be open for exhibitor and participant parking, livestock, campground access and livestock trailer parking, drop offs and deliveries. This plan is intended to reduce the traffic and parking wait times and everyone will have more time available to enjoy the fair. **ALL SERVICE VEHICLES MUST BE OFF THE GROUNDS BY 8:45 AM. ALL SERVICE & LIVESTOCK VEHICLES MUST USE THE LIVESTOCK GATE. SIGNS**

WILL BE POSTED. VEHICLES ILLEGALLY PARKED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS WILL BE TOWED AT OWNERS EXPENSE.

Parking & Traffic Regulations

A. No general admission gat will permit vehicular traffic to proceed through the gates, except via gate 4. All person entering in vehicles will be subject to the admissions policy stated in item #19 of Rules a& Regulations.

B. Parking passes will be issued, upon request, to those exhibitors who wish to park inside the fairgrounds. Vehicles may not be parked along barns or adjacent to stalls except as noted in item "E". Passes must be displayed and entries paid or will be removed. **No CAMPING IN THESE VEHICLES.**

C. Under no circumstance will vehicles (other than emergency) be permitted to move within the fairgrounds between the hours of 9:00 am and 9:00 pm on Friday & Saturday, and 9:00 am - 5:00 pm o Sunday. This rule is for the safety of the public, exhibitors and animals. Exhibitors who violate this rule may be disqualified or barred from entering in subsequent years as deemed appropriate by the Directors.

D. No parking will be permitted on the fairgrounds in any area except the inside parking lot. Limited space is available for trailers, campers and motor homes in the camping area. These vehicles will be parked in designated, prearranged spaces and must have a valid, numbered parking pass, which can be purchased through the office. This will be checked daily. Spaces are limited in size and only accommodate one camping unit and a max of one vehicle. Permission to park campers and motor homes will only be granted to exhibitors who will remain in the space for the entire fair.

E. All areas with the exception of the inside parking area and the designated camper spaces are considered loading/unloading zones. Livestock exhibitors are permitted to park in these areas while loading/unloading animals and equipment only. Maximum duration of parking is 20 minutes.

F. All exceptions of the above rules must be **PREAPPROVED** by a VIEx board member on duty in the show office. and will only be granted in the event of an emergency.

Vancouver Island Exhibition Rules & Regulations

- 1.** Entry fee must accompany entry forms. Cheques are to be made payable to the Vancouver Island Exhibition Association, and mailed to the respective person as stated in the Division entered. For particulars regarding entry fees, see under each Division heading; with exception of Livestock.
- 2.** Entry fees are non-refundable in the event of entry being cancelled by the exhibitor.
- 3.** Entries must be made on or before the entry closing date in order to afford sufficient time to examine entry papers, to correspond with parties when necessary, for corrections of errors or omissions. The board reserves the right to accept entries later than the advertised date of closing.
- 4.** Exhibits must be in place and ready for judging at the times listed under each division.

5. No person will be allowed to enter in competition more than one specimen in any one class except where otherwise mentioned. This rule doesn't apply to livestock.
6. All entries in the exhibition must be the bona fide property of (with a minimum of 14 days) and made or raised by the exhibitor except where otherwise stated.
7. No persons shall be allowed to engage the judge in conversation or otherwise interfere in his work during the time the exhibits are being judged. Those doing so will be excluded from the competition. Foul language or abuse directed at any show official will result in disqualification from the entire show.
8. Exhibitors must provide for the delivery of their exhibits to the Exhibition Grounds. The Association will not in any case make provision for the transportation or be subject to any expense thereof, either on delivery to or return from the grounds. All expenses connected therewith must be provided for by the Exhibitor and all freight, express and cartage charges must be prepaid.
9. Exhibits not accompanied by their owners or their agents, must be considered entirely the owner's risk, and may be addressed to the Exhibitor care of the Exhibition Association, who will receive them at the ground if all cartage and other charges have been prepaid.
10. The Exhibition will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of the exhibits sent to the Exhibition, but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them, and should any exhibit or portion thereof be injured, stolen or lost, the Exhibition will give assistance towards the recovery of the same, but will not be liable or make payment for the value thereof.
11. Exhibitors, concessionaires and all other persons are only admitted to the grounds on the understanding that they will cooperate with the Exhibition Association in providing an agricultural fair. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, no suit instituted or maintained against the Exhibition Association, its officers or agents, by or on behalf of any visitor, or any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit on the Exhibition grounds or occupying any space therein.
12. The Exhibition Association shall not be liable for any loss to an exhibitor occasioned by fire, accident, condition of structure or the negligence of other exhibitors or officials or otherwise howsoever.
13. No prize cards fixed on the exhibits by the judges or the secretary shall be removed without authorization, otherwise the prize will not be paid.
14. Any article, stand or other equipment left in the buildings or grounds after the close of the Exhibition will be at the owner's risk.
15. The winners must sign for all Perpetual Cups and Trophies present by the Exhibition all items must be left with the Show Secretary for engraving.
16. All protests must be made in writing and given to the President before 5:00 pm, on the last day of the Fair, with a deposit of \$25.00. The deposit will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.
17. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion and other exhibits liable to cause damage, accidents or injury to property or to persons coming in contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith, and every such exhibitor shall indemnify the Exhibitions' from and against all claims and demands', costs, charges and expenses which may incur, suffer or be put to, by reason of any accident or of any [person being injured or suffering damage through or by any reason of any such exhibit, performance or concession not being properly guarded or the public not being properly protected there from.
18. Except where otherwise noted in this prize book. No exhibit shall be removed from the exhibition until after 5:00 pm on the last day of the exhibition, August 19, 2018.
19. All exhibitors and personas accompanying same must pay daily gate admissions to the fair grounds, which can be exchanged (with proof of purchase) and the additional moneys to make up the sum for a 3-day pass at the gate, from the show office or from any board member.
20. Should there not be sufficient funds on hand to pay prizes in full they will be paid pro rata.
21. Vouchers for merch offered as prizes must be presented to the donor within one month after the date or they will be forfeited.
22. The Exhibition Association will not be responsible for payment or prizes offered by others.
23. Parking areas will be provided as far as possible within the area available in Beban Park. The Exhibition will not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage by fire, theft or otherwise.
24. With the exception of members of the RCMP, no person will carry or attempt to carry any arms, ammunition or explosives anywhere on the Exhibitions Grounds at any time.
25. No smoking in the barns. Refrain from smoking, exhibitors are requested to politely ask any smoker to refrain from smoking in the barn area.
26. Exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations set out herein. Failure to comply will render Exhibitor liable to being barred from exhibiting in subsequent years, at the discretion of the Executive.

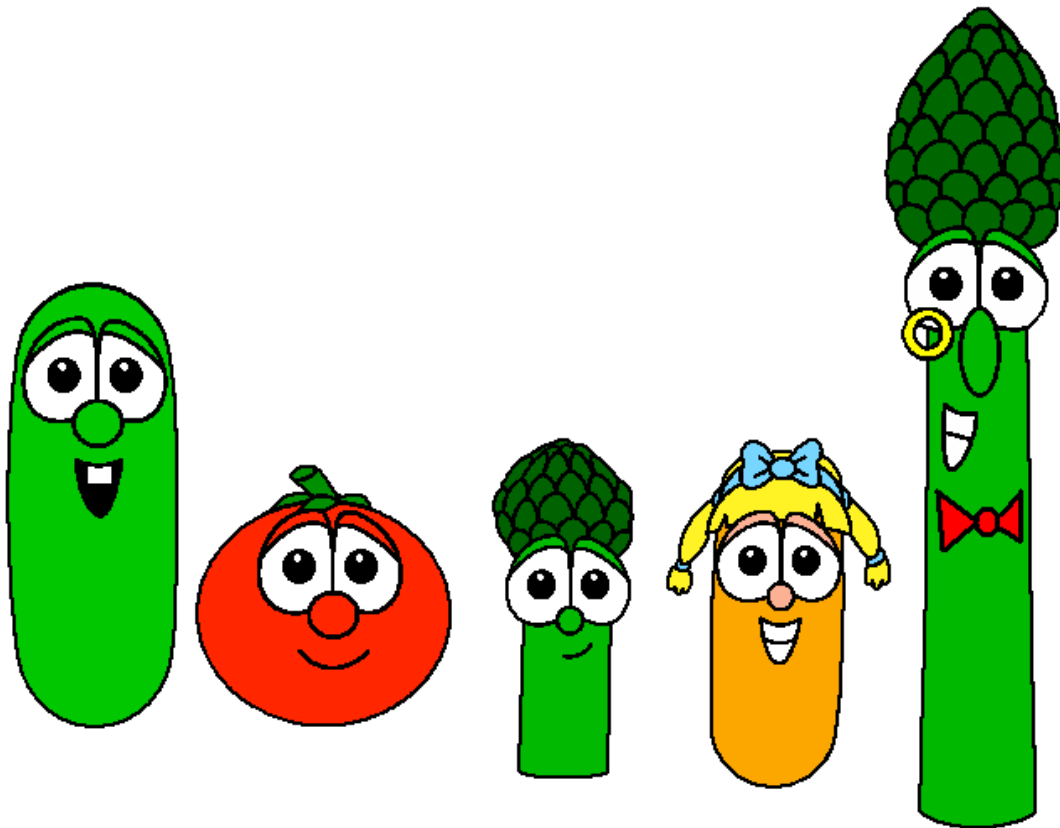

Entry fees are non-refundable. All entry fees are payable when entry form is made and must accompany the form. Entries to be made on proper entry forms. Entries can only be cancelled upon satisfactory proof being given to the livestock director that circumstance beyond the control of the exhibitor prevent the exhibitor from showing. Exhibitors from outside the Province should consult their local district Health of Animals Veterinarian to determine the appropriate qualifying certificate.

Rules and Regulations:

1. No overnight sleeping in the Livestock barns will be allowed, unless approved by the Livestock Director.
2. The amount of space allotted Exhibitors for storage of feed and straw and for a tack room will be in relations to the number and nature of the entries and is subject to the discretion of the Livestock Director.
3. Entries close August 1 or as posted in each division and must be postmarked no later than that date, as due to restricted space, accommodation will be allotted on the basis of entry received in accordance with above.
4. Registered name and number of animal must be on the entry form. Papers to be available for inspection before judging commences.
5. Registration and transfer of animals to be shown must be the Canadian National Livestock Records or in the Regular Holstein Friesian Herd Books or Canada prior to the closing date of entries at the Exhibition. Foreign entries must also be registered by this date in their respective Foreign Herd Books, recognized by the Canadian purebred Organizations.
6. Animals are to be shown in classes in which Exhibitor's entry form designates. Identification may be required before the animals enter the ring.
7. Committee chairperson will arrange space.
8. 4-H Calf Club member's entries will only be accepted if they are qualified and not in competition with the other entries from the same farm or breeding unit.
9. 4-H Calf Club member's entries will only be accepted if they are qualified and not in competition with other entries from the same farm or breeding unit.
10. 4-H entries will be judged on a separate program.
11. Exhibitors must bring out their animals for stock judging when requested.
12. All livestock must undergo a Veterinarian inspection and any found with communicable diseases or infections will be refused, as well as other animals that may have come into contact with them and if admitted through an oversight, on the advice of the Veterinarian, is authorized to so refuse any animal that is not in apparent good health.
13. For public and animal safety, all livestock must be halter broken and/or controllable while on the VIEX grounds.
14. All livestock vehicles must use livestock entrance, located on Labieux road only.
15. All bulls two years of age and older must have nose leaders in their noses and neck rope and must have adequate staff for control of such animals. Bulls or any other animals that is unruly and cannot be properly controlled will be disqualified at the discretion of the Exhibitions management. Bulls may not be led in the

barn or exhibited in the ring by any person under 14 years old.

16. Substitutions and additional entries:

a. Substitutions for health reasons only within any section for single animals in the same class will be permitted on presentation of a Veterinary Certificate covering the animal originally provided.

b. The animal offered as a substitute was owned by the exhibitor on the closing date of entries and

c. The exhibitor furnished to the Livestock director the information with respect to the substitute animals required.

17. Insurance is mandatory that all exhibitors shall obtain public liability insurance to protect themselves and to have proof of such insurance available upon request. Such insurance is obtained at nominal cost, consult your insurance broker.

18. The management reserves the right to eliminate any breed or class where it is considered there is not sufficient competition. The VIEX reserves the right to limit entries where entries exceed the accommodations. The VIEX will be responsible for the first sawdust only in the barns.

19. The VIEX reserves the right to combine classes.

20. The VIEX reserves the right to refuse any entry and to return any entry fee without being liable for compensations.

21. All livestock are to be on the grounds by 8:00 pm Thursday of fair week and not leave the grounds until 5:00 pm Sunday of fair week.

1. Open to members of 4-H clubs following regulations under the 4-H program, of the BCMAF Public Affairs Branch.
2. Non-exhibiting 4-H members may purchase the VIEx 3-day pass or pay gate fee.
3. Club members may enter registered calves, lambs and horses in open class only if their entry meets all requirements of the particular open class and does not exceed the maximum number of entries allowed in the class from one farm or breeding unit. In addition, club members must submit the regular entry form and pay the regular entry fee for the open class.
4. All 4-H livestock must be in the place by 9:00 PM, Thursday of Fair week.
5. All livestock except 4-H horses will remain on the grounds until 5:00 PM, Sunday, of Fair week, when they will be released. Each 4-H Livestock Club will be expected to designate two members for each eight animals, to look after club entries. Please don't expect other clubs to do this for you.
6. All calves and lambs entered in the 4-H show must be stabled in the 4-H section of the Livestock buildings, unless special permission to do otherwise is obtained from the Livestock Director.
7. All 4-H cattle exhibits must comply with the Agriculture Canada Health of Animals Branch Regulations and Disease Control.
8. Should any questions arise that are not provided for in the Rules and Regulations, the decision of Executive for the Exhibition shall be final.
9. All 4-H Exhibits to be judged on the Danish System, where there are six or more entries in a class, except the 4-H horse performance, which will place in a straight line up to the sixth. All 4-H livestock clubs are entered in the Stall Competition.
10. Members must exhibit their own project animals in Showmanship classes. Another club member may help with the showing of other project units if help is needed.
11. No 4-H Exhibitor will be allowed to sleep in the barns, but will be permitted to staying in campers, only if parental supervision is provided.
12. All 4-H club leaders are to provide the Fair with a list of their respective supervisors. List should be attached to entry forms.
13. A 10:00 PM curfew will apply to all 4-H members.
14. The 4-H member **must** do any clipping or grooming of a 4-H animal at the fair and it **must not** be by an adult or leader or that animal will be disqualified from competition.
15. All barn walkways must be kept clear at all times. Clipping and grooming chutes and other such equipment must be placed in designated areas.
16. All 4-H regulations will apply for the duration of the fair. 4-H members are compelled to abide by the S.A.D. rules. The VIEx will not tolerate any violation of these rules. All offenders will be sent home.
17. VIEx will host 4-H dinner on the Friday night of the Fair at 5:00 PM this will be hosted outside the 4-H Barnyard

Methods of Judging

American System

Used in all Divisions for Open. The American System considers product standards and fulfillment of exhibit requirements. The judge inspects all exhibits in a Class and comparatively ranks them, selecting only one first place, one second place and one third place. All ribbons will be awarded on the individual worth of the exhibit. In no case will an exhibit be given a ribbon that it would not merit in full competition.

Danish System

Used in all Divisions for Youth. Each entry is judged according to quality and a standard of work. **They are not compared against each other, but against this standard.** Each exhibit will receive a ribbon: first place – excellent, second place – good, third place – worthy. All exhibits will be judged and those not receiving the above will receive Honourable mention or participant.

Only an entry from your 2018 fair, exhibition or festival can be entered into each category.

The winning entry in each Member’s Choice categories will be awarded a \$50.00 cash prize, together with a beautiful plaque in each category.

8. All exhibitors must pay advertised gate admissions to enter the fair.
9. No exhibits, stands or other equipment will be left in the buildings or grounds after 7:00 pm Sunday, August 19, 2018.
10. No smoking and or pets in the Home Arts Building
11. Exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations set out herein. Failure to comply will render Exhibitor liable to being barred from exhibiting in next and subsequent years, at the discretion on the Executive. Home Arts opens daily at 9:00 am and closes at 9:00 pm Friday and Saturday and 5:00 pm on Sunday.

13. The Board of Directors reserves the final right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle all questions connected with, or incident to, the fair which are not covered herein.

Home and Garden Arts - Division Entry Procedures

3. **Perishables:** (Flowers, Vegetables, Baking, etc.) We request that all perishable items be entered Thursday, August 16, 2018 between **9:00 AM and 11:30 AM only**. Please note any exposed or open food may be subject to pest control.
4. The VIEx takes reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of all exhibits. The exhibitor exhibits their entries **at their own risk**. The VIEx shall not be held responsible or liable for any entry that is lost, stolen or damaged, in any way.
5. **How to enter:** Welcome! Bring your entries to the Entry tables. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to fill out one Exhibit Tag for each item entered. Collect your ID ticket #. **Print all information as required on the Exhibit Tag.**
6. **Age categories:** **Youth** ages 17 and under **Open** ages 18 up. (Please state on exhibit tag.) Youth who fail to fill in age will automatically be placed in the highest Youth age group.
7. We welcome all special needs exhibitors. Please state "special needs" on Exhibit Tag, as this will be taken into consideration when judging.

- Are judged against perfection, not against other entries.
- An exhibitor may make/have more than one entry per class provided entries are of a different variety.
- Entries requiring more than one should be as uniform as possible in colour, shape and size.
- Enter in the correct class and enter the precise number
- called for, no more, no less; otherwise the entry will be disqualified.
- Evaluate the type, quantity, size, colour, condition and form of the items. Discard damaged or flawed produce.
- Quality being equal, unnamed entries will lose marks.

Judging Standards for Non-Specialized shows, published by the BC Council of Garden Clubs, explains how to select and prepare horticultural items for exhibition, i.e.: what constitutes a perfect product, how items should be displayed, how points are awarded and how flaws are evaluated.

Guideline for Foods

Cakes – should have a flat or slightly rounded top, moist, fine grained, slightly glossy surface, fine velvety texture. Does not crumble significantly when cut, is tender, has a characteristic, pleasant flavour. All cakes use layered 8" or 9" square pan. Cut cake into 9 pieces; display centre and one corner only.

Baking Powder Biscuits – should have fairly smooth surface, delicately-crisp crust with a slightly moist interior, flaky and tender and pleasant flavour.

Quick Breads and Muffins – should be lightly browned, symmetrical, bumpy rough surface, tiny holes, not tunnels.

Yeast Breads – should have smooth rounded top, evenly brown, thin crust, moist interior. Fine even interior texture, light pleasant taste and pleasant aroma.
