A. This is a 3-day fair therefore all animals and displays must remain for the entire duration of the Exhibition. All exhibitors shall be familiar with and abide by the Vancouver Island Exhibition “General Rules and Regulations for Exhibitors as well as the following.

| <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Entries & fees MUST be received at the Vancouver Island Exhibition office by 4pm, Monday, September 16th, 2024.2. Each exhibitor must pay one \$10 herd fee3. Late entries will be accepted until 4pm Wednesday, September 18th, 2024. Entry and herd fees double for late entries.4. No alteration to entries nor substitutions will be accepted after 4pm, Thursday, September 19th, 20245. Please mail entries with payment – cheques to be made out to: Vancouver Island Exhibition. Mail entries with payment to Vancouver Island Exhibition. #4-2300 Bowen Road, Nanaimo, BC V9T 3K7.6. Entry forms must be complete and legible. Please request an excel spreadsheet from the show secretary or use Livestock (Goats) Entry Form in the back of the book.7. Goats must be stabled by 7 pm on Thursday, September 19th, 2024. Early arrivals are permitted but exhibitors MUST contact the show secretary or show chairperson for approval prior to date of arrival.8. Due to limited barn space, a maximum of 12 animals per breed per exhibitor allowed.9. A licensed Veterinarian will examine ALL animals. Any showing evidence of contagious or infectious disease must be removed immediately.10. The onsite Veterinarian will make the final decision if an animal is to be removed – the show committee will NOT override the Veterinarian’s decision.11. The Veterinary check will start at 7 pm, Thursday, September 19th, 2024. Exhibitors must be present to handle their own animals. All animals are to be brought out of stalls by owners and vet checked in the aisle.12. Original CGS registration papers for each animal being shown must be present onsite during competition except for classes 1 & 2 in which case proof of registration must be available online at the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation (CLRC) website.13. Checks of registration papers at 7pm, Thursday, September 19th, 2024. Exhibitors must be available.14. Exhibitors are responsible to check animals’ tattoos to be sure the tattoo is exactly what is on the registration papers for each animal entered. Animals who have an error in their tattoo must not be shown in the show ring before correction is made with CLRC. | <ol style="list-style-type: none">15. Judging commences at 10:00 am, Saturday, September 21st, 2024.16. Age of goat is calculated from the date of birth to Saturday, September 21st, 2024.17. All goats must have CGS registration number and be legibly tattooed according to their registration papers. Owners must submit the entry form and fee to Vancouver Island Exhibition. Other people or Agents can show goats in the ring and sign if the doe receives a leg.18. Full Canadians will be shown in purebred classes.19. Group classes are limited to two entries per exhibitor per class.20. All entries in group classes must also have been entered in their respective breed specific classes.21. Exhibitors leaving before 5 pm Sunday without prior written approval of the Vancouver Island Exhibition and the show committee will FORFEIT all prize monies.22. No horned goats, no bucks and no animals not being shown are permitted on the grounds (nursing kids excepted with paid entry fee as long as the number of animals does not exceed 12 animals per breed per exhibitor.)23. Bedding will be supplied by the Vancouver Island Exhibition.24. Dress code in the show ring: CGS rules apply; Appropriate white shirt. Appropriate white or black pants, shorts, or skirt. Exhibitors, please ensure all handlers are properly attired according to CGS show rule book.25. Canadian Goat Society rules will govern this show (Full rule book available at: www.goats.ca/shows/)26. Exhibitors are expected to decorate their stalls and to provide educational information to the Exhibition patrons.27. Does must be over 10 days fresh with no bloody discharge.28. Prize money will be paid to a maximum of two prizes per exhibitor per class.29. No charge for exhibitor parking. Use Labieux Road entrance and let them know you are exhibitors. Camping on site – contact show secretary. |

Doe in milk, 2 years old (over 24 months and under 36 months) 5. Doe in milk, 3-5 years old (over 36 months and under 60 months) 6. Doe in milk, 5-6 years old (over 60 months and under 84 months) 7. Doe in milk, 7 year old and older (over 84 months) < selection of senior champion from classes 3-7 > <selection of grand champion from classes 1-8 > 8. Dairy Herd – A group of 4 Does of same breed (owned by the exhibitor) 14. Generations Class (at least 3 consecutive generations) (not necessarily owned by one exhibitor)
